Foley Equipment CAT Care Event Features Certified Rebuild

Wichita, KS - Foley Equipment hosted a CAT Care Event in Pittsburg on CAT Certified Rebuilds May 12 on the campus of Pittsburg State.

Foley Equipment hosts a number of CAT Care events every year. The events address the needs of customers by featuring a topic of interest to customers.

Certified Rebuilds have become increasingly important in today's tough economic climate as machine owners and operators look to extend the life of existing machines to avoid the expense of a new machine purchase. CAT Certified Rebuilds run the gamut from basic drive train and engine rebuilds to full machine disassembly and ground up repair/replace projects including new paint and a new warranty.

This event featured Crawford County's 12H motor grader rebuild which was just completed. The event drew 35 customers from southeast Kansas and included a chance to get a close look at the rebuilt motor grader, a BBQ dinner and a presentation on the Certified Rebuild program including testimonials from representatives of Crawford County and Labette County.

The Crawford County rebuild included the addition of a QuickEvac™ system and attendees had the opportunity to see a demonstration of the process. QuickEvac system empties most diesel engine sumps in less than 60 seconds and allows for a complete and thorough engine "lube, oil and filter change" in less than 20 minutes. The QuickEvac system gets equipment back to work faster and keeps it running longer.
